### **SAVE THE DATE! 2015 VIRGINIA WORKERS' COMPENSATION EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCE, OCT. 21-22, 2015**

**Richmond, Virginia, April 21, 2015:**

The Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission Chairman, Roger L. Williams, announced today that dates have been finalized for the 2015 Virginia Workers' Compensation Commission (VWC) Educational Conference. This year's conference will take place in Richmond on Oct. 21-22, 2015. The conference is being held in cooperation with the International Workers' Compensation Foundation (IWCF).

For the first time, the program will be open to everyone. Attorneys, insurance adjusters, employees, insurance agents, third party administrators, healthcare providers, medical and rehabilitation professionals, and human resource professionals will receive valuable information on the Virginia workers' compensation system at this conference. Also for the first time, the conference will include an exhibit hall featuring service providers.

The program will offer presentations and workshops led by experts from the VWC, as well as the private sector. The focus of the discussions will be on common questions and significant aspects of workers' compensation in Virginia. The conference will offer continuing education credit for attorneys, rehabilitation providers, and human resources professionals.
