Reporting Change

As of 10/1/08 the Commission started an initiative to become paperless by moving to electronic submission and processing of all claims. The existing system and the new EDI system have different requirements and as such a different set of data elements. As we move towards our goal of becoming paperless, this report will be split between the two disparate systems, and as such in two distinct reports. The report marked "EDI Report" will include those claims filed electronically in 2009. The report marked "Part A" contains information entered into our "Legacy" system for the entire year 2009.

Previously, because the EDI initiative is occurring in stages, a single claim may be entered (and counted) by each of the systems. This redundancy is limited to accidents that occurred on or after 10/1/08.





Medical PaymentsBy Payment Type





Compensation PaymentsBy Payment Type




